

Executive Director' Note:

Greetings!

As we reflect on Maine TREE's achievements in 2025, we are proud to highlight growth, stability, and lasting impact as the cornerstones of our success. Through expanded program offerings and thoughtful consideration, we've established effective program models that enhance our ability to connect and build a robust network that supports the ecological, economic, and social health of Maine's Forest Community.

Looking at our 2025 finances, we continued to grow operationally, primarily through increases in grants from private foundations and government sources. Our program revenue also increased modestly. While revenue from endowment draws remains stable, it represents a smaller portion of our income. Similarly, donations from individuals and businesses remained stable in 2025 but accounted for less than 15% of our revenue. Overall, our increased grants and program revenue enabled us to expand our impact as an organization, and we must increase contributions from individuals and businesses to sustainably grow the organization.

All that we accomplish, we accomplish together. The strength of Maine TREE and Maine's Forest Community is a testament to the outstanding people who contribute to our story. We truly appreciate your participation and unwavering support.




